## SHADOW RUN'S THIRD ANNUAL NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN UP

I have been working with the Hillsborough County Office of Neighborhood Relations in procuring funding for a neighborhood clean up. The Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) has grant funding for the Community Clean Up Program. The specific purpose of this program is to encourage neighbors to conduct clean up projects in the community, which can include electronics, litter pick up, yard waste, appliances, metal, furniture and wood for deposit in dumpsters.

### *Items that will be accepted at the dumpsters include the following:*

- **Electronics:** (No charge for electronics), Televisions, VHS and DVD players, stereos, speakers, computers, laptops, monitors, printers, fax machines, copiers, radios, scanners, telephones, cell phones, pagers, computer games, cables, video and audio equipment, and microwave ovens
- **Batteries.**
- **Metal items:** Old refrigerators, ovens, water heaters, metal shelving, steel and other metals.
- **Furniture:** Couches, tables, chairs, mattresses, etc.
- **Construction debris:** Concrete, bricks, glass, mirrors, roofing materials, fencing, wood, etc.

The dumpsters will be available on the West side of the Shadow Run Dam from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on Saturday, May 14th. We will have trucks with men available to haul heavy items from your residence to the dumpsters. Call me on Saturday on my cell phone for large item pickups at 813-767-9372.

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## DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITATION

Board Members,

I have been asked to respond to community concerns regarding door to door solicitation.

Solicitation is addressed by County Ordinances. There already exists a written code regarding solicitation on private property and there is an on-going County Commission action regarding the establishment of an ordinance covering street solicitation and pan-handling.

I am not aware of a provision in the County Ordinance that permits a subdivision or HOA to collectively prohibit solicitation on private property. The ordinance prohibits solicitation by anyone, any company, or contractor of any company on private property upon which a "No Solicitation" sign is prominently displayed. A small sign attached to the outside of the home at the door would suffice. A number of subdivisions have had added a "No Solicitation" sign to their entrance monuments, others, a street sign at the entrance. While it is clear that such "sub-division" sign can be construed to address the common grounds, it is unclear whether the entrance sign can apply against solicitors entering a private, homeowner lot which does not

displayed the required "No Solicitation" sign. Nonetheless, most legitimate (my word) solicitors will heed the subdivision sign and avoid such communities entirely. Legitimate solicitors are those who have registered with the County as required and properly display the permit on their person. Should a solicitor at the door not display a valid permit on their person, or if the solicitor has disregarded the sign on the private property, the Sheriff can be called, however, it is then a trespass matter. The ideal plan would be to suggest to homeowners, that if they are interested in prohibiting solicitors, they post a sign at the door. The subdivision could also add the verbiage to the entrance sign or post a street sign (And hope the county does not care). Currently, Shadow Run has no such sign at the entrances.

It is very difficult to enforce the no solicitation ordinance, since it is a code violation which must be witnessed by a code enforcement officer or a related no trespass violation (which I think would apply to non-permitted solicitors or any solicitors on private, no solicitation posted property) witnessed by a Sheriff deputy.

In any event, neighbors should be encouraged to contact the Sheriff (non-emergency at (813) 247-8200) if any suspicious person(s) come knocking on the door or are observed meandering through the subdivision, especially if not displaying the permit. The caller should report that suspicious person(s) are in the community.

## THE SHADOW RUN BUDGET 2011/2012

Dear Fellow Home Owners,

By now you have all received the budget for the next fiscal year. As you may have noticed there were no changes to the amount of the annual dues again this year but what you may not have noticed was that there are some major changes in where our money is going to be spent during this next budget period. For those of you who failed to read the notice that we placed on the back of the budget we are reprinting it here for your review.

“YR 2011/12 BUDGET NOTE: The insurance line item for this budget reflects a significant increase for Directors and Officers (D&O) Liability Insurance premiums due to recent claims experience. The policy cost has increased from \$ 2,450 last fiscal year to \$ 5,440 this budget year. Also, because coverage could only be obtained through alternate market sources, again due to recent claims experience, the retention (deductible) has been increased from \$ 2,500 to \$ 20,000 per claim. Recent claims against your Association included a State arbitration matter filed by a homeowner and an unrelated lawsuit filed by another homeowner. The arbitration matter was dismissed by the State and the other lawsuit voluntarily dis-

missed by the homeowner. In each matter, the prior D&O carrier was obligated to defend the Association and in each matter paid claims for Association legal expenses above the deductible.”

What does this mean to each of us? The cost of our insurance annual premium has more than doubled and our deductible has increased by \$17,500. Even though both of the actions were dismissed. This means that the next matter filed against our HOA will result in an approximate additional charge, through a special assessment, of \$60 for each and every one of us for every additional claim filed against us. This board of directors HAS & WILL address all valid homeowner concerns submitted to us in writing at [www.ourshadowrun.com](http://www.ourshadowrun.com) to avoid this type of needless litigation. We believe that these costs could have been avoided. So please, Think Before You Litigate.
